4th-6th Boys- Dress shirt and tie, uniform pants ok, dark socks, dark shoes.

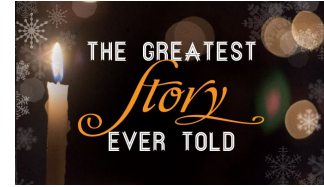
4th-6th Girls- Christmas dress or skirt/top as above.
